The book of Acts is more than just the history of the early church. It is a template of the Christian life. Christianity rapidly spread across the Roman Empire in the first century because followers of Jesus saw their faith as more than an add-on to their already busy routines. Jesus *was* their life, and he redefined *possible*.

HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OF THIS READING PLAN

INTENTION

- Set apart 30-60 minutes each day to slowly and intentionally read the chapter assigned.
- Before reading, ask the Holy Spirit to illuminate the truth of God's Word in a new and fresh way in your heart. Believe that he will.

REFLECTION

- After reading, spend time reflecting or thinking deeply on how the text spoke directly to you.
- Do this by sitting quietly before God. Open your heart to his voice. Believe that your Heavenly Father desires to speak directly to you. Just listen.

APPLICATION

- Use the "Reflection and Journaling" questions to record all you sense God spoke to you from Scripture.
- Do this by journaling. If you are new to journaling give it a try!
- There's no right or wrong way to write out what you sense God speaking.
- And it's often very encouraging to go back and read the thoughts and prayers you took the time to record on paper.
- Remember, all you journal is between you and God.

COMMUNITY

- It's important to talk about what God is doing in your life through this sermon series and reading plan. Being known in community is a critical part of growing in your relationship with God.
- Do this by making time in your calendar for coffee or a walk with a trusted friend.
- Or come ready to share in your community group.
